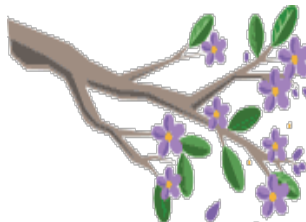

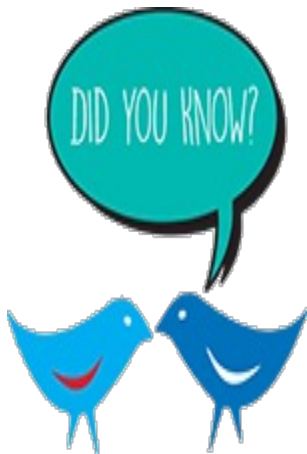

On 9/8, the Together in Christ Building Team built a handicapped ramp at a home on Ebert Street near Winston-Salem. The job involved two four foot landings and totaled 32 ft. in length. It took 13 team members about two hours to complete the job. On 9/13, twelve members traveled to Greensboro and installed a 36' long ramp with extra thick decking boards for bearing heavier than normal weight. This project took about two hours to complete. On 9/14, 5 team members helped build a back porch on a mobile home in the Wallburg area. On 9/26, 12 team members recovered a previously built ramp from a home in the Reedy Creek area and then reconfigured it and installed it at a home in the Churchland area. This project took about two hours. On 9/28, team members installed the skirting on the above mentioned mobile home in the Wallburg area.



- The Outreach Committee met on Sunday, September 18th, to finalize plans for the September 24th live auction & meal. We are pleased to report that the proceeds from the auction were \$5,844. 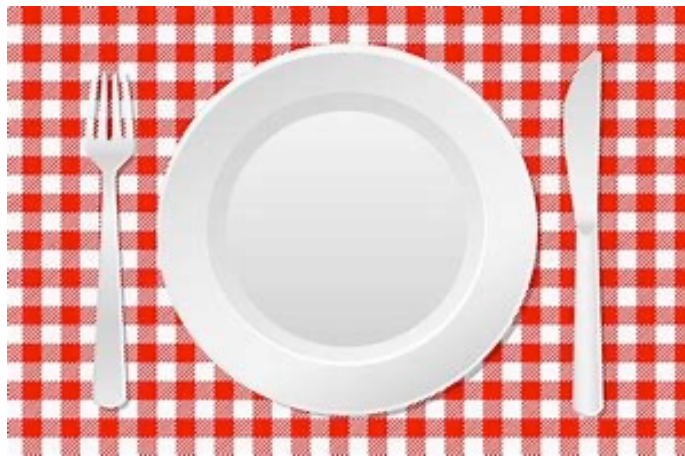
